UASC Prepares for an Active 2008! Join Us!

The Underwater Archaeological Society of Chicago (UASC) will be working mostly on one specific shipwreck to complete the survey of that sunken craft so that an official REPORT can be published by this year's end. That wreck is the *Material Service* barge, which is 240 feet long, was built in 1929 at Sturgeon Bay, WI, and sank in a tragic accident about 2,000 feet northeast of the Calumet Harbor Light in 38 feet of water on July 29, 1936, with the loss of its sand cargo and, sadly, 15 of the 22 workers who were on board. UASC hopes to finalize survey work and underwater sketching, photography, videography, and research.

Second in priority for UASC work this summer are several other shipwrecks off Chicago, including:

The wooden steamer, *Iowa*, lies broken up in 40 feet of water about four miles off Navy Pier, between two cribs. Launched as the *Menominee* in 1872 at Manitowoc, WI, this ship replaced one of the steamers, the *Navarino*, destroyed in the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. Rebuilt and renamed *Iowa* in 1896, this 202-foot-long vessel was crushed by ice off Chicago harbor on February 4, 1915, with the crew and the one passenger walking to shore on the ice.

The steel ship named *The Straits of Mackinac* (the word "The" is actually part of its name) was built in 1928 in the Detroit area for use as a ferry in the Straits of Mackinac fleet in those days before the Mackinac Bridge (pre-1957). This ship, lying inactive for many years, was cleaned up and sunk in 78 feet of water off Chicago on April 10, 2003, as the largest ship ever scuttled to create a dive site in the Great Lakes. **BE SURE TO JOIN THE FUN THIS YEAR!**

January, 2007: UASC member **Liz Jurkacek** outlined survey procedures (complete with handouts, charts, diagrams and sample forms) and state funding for our survey work.

February, 2007: UASC member **Cris Kohl** talked about researching Great Lakes shipwrecks. **Joan Forsberg** brought great food for the 30 members (including 8 new ones) there. **March, 2007:** UASC members **Bob & Claire Gadbois** outlined the sometimes painstaking work in creating a 30-second piece of video for a shipwreck presentation.

April, 2007: UASC members **John & Ruth Loftus** did a presentation on the wreck of (Railroad Ferry) *Barge No. 2*, and **John Bell** discussed software for creating montages.

May, 2007: UASC member **Cris Kohl** led a discussion on proposed legislation in Michigan to solicit diver "donations" for the maintenance of the underwater preserves there.

June, 2007: UASC member **Tony Kiefer** showed the Zion Mystery Wreck presentation and photomosaic techniques.

October, 2007: Halloween Night! Maritime Historian **Fred Neuschel** spoke about part of his new book, *Lives and Legends of the Christmas Tree Ships*, and promised to return.

November, 2007: Maritime Historian **Tom Lutz** talked about overlooked Chicago maritime history personalities.



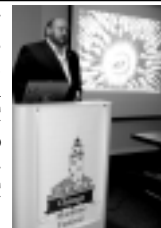

In mid-Sept., 2007, members of the Underwater Archaeological Society of Chicago headed out to the site of the schooner, *Wells Burt*, which sank with all hands off Chicago in a violent storm on May 20, 1883. The purpose was to determine if any very noticeable changes had occurred in the 20 years since UASC first surveyed this shipwreck. No changes were noticed. This project received some media coverage -- which is scheduled to be included as a segment of a History Channel episode of "Underground Cities" on Feb. 20, 2008. 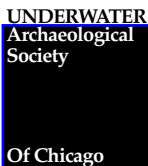
